# **PROJECTS**

Location of instructional and research facilities, as well as necessary campus support facilities, such as housing and parking, is directed by UC San Diego's Long Range Development Plan (LRDP), which is prepared in response to campus enrollment and population projections. ## PROJECT UNDER COMPLETION

### **TATA HALL OF SCIENCES**



UC San Diego named one of its newest science buildings, Tata Hall in honor of an Indian philanthropists who provided the school \$70 million to enable research associated with fighting insect-borne diseases. One half of the \$70 million funding will support the new Tata Institute for Genetics and Society, which will be housed in a six story science building slated for completion this fall.

The proposed project is a six story plus basement building with approximately 129,000 gross square feet of biology, chemistry/biochemistry research and instructional space, including wet and dry laboratories and equipment rooms, an auditorium and a Nuclear Magnetic Resonance (NMR) facility. Approximate project cost is \$115,500,000

The Tata Trust of Mumbai made this generous contribution in 2017 upon learning about the work of Ethan Bier, a UC San Diego researcher who developed a gene editing technique that shows promise for breeding mosquitoes that do not spread malaria. Malaria kills close to 500,000 people per year worldwide, and sickens millions more. About 20,000 of those deaths occur in India, the world's second most populous nation.

About 6,000 undergraduates currently major in biology at UC San Diego, which has long served as a training ground for the life sciences industry. The "biosci" program is helping to fuel the broader growth of the campus. The university's biosci division is well known for producing distinguished scientists. Three of its graduates — Bruce Beutler, Susumu Tonegawa and Venkatraman Ramakrishnan — each went on to win a Nobel Prize.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The TATA hall of Sciences located in the Revelle College Neighborhood and designed by CO Architects will provide much needed research and instructional laboratories to support the Division of Biological Sciences and Division of Physical Sciences, Departments of Chemistry and Biochemistry.

The building would include a new service and fire access road connecting the proposed building site to Scholar's Drive south. The project is consistent with UC San Diego's 2004 Long Range Development Plan.
