Projects

The location of instructional, research and campus support facilities, such as housing and parking, is directed by UC San Diego's Long Range Development Plan, which is prepared in response to campus enrollment and population projections. Projects in the Pipeline

This month's Community Group Update highlights four construction projects and special events scheduled in April 2019. UC San Diego is in the process of a transformation that is vibrant, collaborative and exciting. We encourage community participation at our events.

Center for Novel Therapeutics



This new structure will promote the creation of new, personalized therapeutics through research conducted by UC San Diego investigators and private sector collaborators in a shared space.

Anticipated Completion: Spring 2019

Location: East Campus Neighborhood

Mesa Housing Pedestrian and Bike Bridge



This bridge will provide a much-needed connection between Mesa Housing and the Medical Center. Spanning 465 linear feet, the bridge will feature a 10-foot-wide bike lane and a separate 6-foot-wide pedestrian walkway.

Anticipated Completion: Fall 2019

Location: East Campus Neighborhood

North Torrey Pines Living and Learning Neighborhood



This project is designed to be a mixed-use community incorporating residential, academic and administrative space. Located on the west campus the Living and Learning Neighborhood will feature dining and retail space as well as parking.

Anticipated Completion: Fall 2020

Location: West Campus Neighborhood

Nuevo East Student Housing



This project will primarily serve single graduate and professional students in apartment-style housing. The project will sit on nine acres and include approximately 1,414 beds in approximately 757 units of one-, two- and three-bedroom apartments.

Anticipated Completion: Winter 2020

Location: Mesa Housing Neighborhood

Nuevo West Graduate Student Housing



This project will redevelop 6.2 acres of existing low-density apartments. Located within the 7-story mid-rise building, the project will also include approximately 82 beds and support and administrative space for UC San Diego Health.

Anticipated Completion: Spring 2020

Location: Mesa Housing Neighborhood

Center for Coastal Studies



The project rehabilitates the existing building to meet current code requirements and support the research program. The Center for Coastal Studies is a premier coastal processes research facility, founded by Doug Inman, a pioneer scientist in the field of coastal oceanography, sediment transport, effects of waves on beaches and coastal evolution. Since its establishment, the scientists in the building have continued to investigate coastal oceanographic processes, specifically as affected by climate change, rising sea levels and shoreline development, and changes.

Anticipated Completion: Fall 2020
