Update for Community Groups – February 2018

PROJECTS

Location of instructional and research facilities, as well as necessary campus support facilities, such as housing and parking, is directed by UC San Diego's Long Range Development Plan (LRDP), which is prepared in response to campus enrollment and population projections. Available on the Planning, Design and Construction website at <u>http://plandesignbuild.ucsd.edu</u> is the Campus Map which is an interactive map where major campus projects are identified by location and include a brief project description.

PROJECTS UNDER CONSTRUCTION

OSLER PARKING STRUCTURE



This project, located at the corner of Gilman Drive and Osler Lane in the School of Medicine Neighborhood, with anticipated completion in Fall 2018, proposes to build 1,350 parking spaces, replacing 250 surface parking spaces. The parking structure will allow access from Gilman Drive, reducing traffic on Osler Lane.

The site was identified because several major campus destinations are within a 10-minute walk of the proposed parking structure.

OUTPATIENT PAVILION



The Outpatient Pavilion, located in the East Campus Neighborhood with anticipated completion in Fall 2018, aims to improve outpatient care by streamlining the resources and support needed to deliver quality care, all in one building.

The approximately 150,000 square-foot facility proposed on a 3.5 acre site, south west of Shiley and west of the Jacobs Medical Center will house several programs and services as extended support to the Jacobs Medical Center. Specific program uses include ambulatory surgery, outpatient imagery, physical therapy and disease-specific clinics that focus on pain, urology, musculoskeletal care, breast health and infusion.

MESA NUEVO EAST AND WEST HOUSING PROJECTS



The Mesa Nuevo East Student Housing project located in the Mesa Housing Neighborhood of the East Campus, with anticipated completion in Winter 2020 will house single graduate and professional students in apartment-style housing. The project includes approximately 1,414 beds (replacing 336 beds) in approximately 757 units of one-, two- and three-bedroom apartments. A student community center is also part of the project

The Mesa Nuevo West Graduate Student Housing project with anticipated completion in Fall 2019 will provide 802 beds (replacing 100 beds) for single graduate



and professional students. The project will consist of two residential buildings, one 12-story high-rise and one 7-story mid-rise, and will contain a mix of studios, two-bedroom, four-bedroom and sixbedroom apartments for a total of 257 units. The project includes a 1,200 space parking structure and a separate small building for a neighborhood market. Located within the 7-story mid-rise building, the project will also include approximately 82 beds and support and administrative space for the UC San Diego Health – La Jolla Family House. Similar to Bannister Family House at the Hillcrest Medical Center, the La Jolla Family House will provide accommodations for patients and patients' families in need of immediate support while receiving medical treatment from UC San Diego Health in La Jolla.

Campus graduate and professional housing's total occupancy cost is projected to be approximately 20 percent lower than the surrounding private market.

TATA HALL FOR THE SCIENCES



CENTER FOR NOVEL THERAPEUTICS

This project located in the Revelle College Neighborhood with anticipated completion in Summer 2018 provides academic space for students studying biological sciences and chemistry/biochemistry at UC San Diego. The 132,000-square-foot project will include eight new wet and dry laboratories and includes several support spaces like equipment rooms, controlled temperature rooms, a satellite vivarium, procedure rooms, chemical storage rooms, tissue culture room and more. Academic office space to support faculty and postdoctoral scholars providing instruction and research in the building are also part of the new construction, along with an auditorium and a Nuclear Magnetic Resonance (NMR) facility.

This project located in the Science Research Park with anticipated completion in Spring 2019 will promote creation of new, personalized therapeutics through research conducted by UC San Diego investigators and private sector collaborators in a shared space. This 110,000 square foot project with 266 parking spaces seeks to unite necessary multidisciplinary expertise to discover new, more effective treatment, diagnostic and prevention interventions and shorten the time required to bring these new interventions to clinical trials. The CNT will also facilitate transition of therapies ready and available for early human testing into the clinical arena through highly sophisticated clinical research resources at UC San Diego.

- Carpools for two or more registered commuters
- Vanpools: Faculty, staff and students may join vanpools at a subsidized rate. Commute Solutions and the vanpool program are evaluating options for continuing vanpool to campus, including a potential opt-in UC systemwide program. During this time, no new routes will be added. The vanpool coordinator will continue to maintain waiting lists and make open seats available on existing vanpool routes.
- <u>Guaranteed Ride Home</u>: a SANDAG program that provides rides in case of illness, unscheduled overtime or family emergencies.
