The 2018 LRDP replaces and supersedes the 2004 LRDP as the planning document in force moving forward with our Capital Improvement Program. Project-level environmental analyses will tier now exclusively from the new LRDP EIR.



The 2018 LRDP reflects several years of planning and collaboration with internal campus stakeholders, adjacent communities and agencies. The proposed 2018 LRDP provides an updated land use plan to guide future physical development of the La Jolla campus.

The 2018 LRDP identifies student, faculty and staff growth projections; describes development objectives and principles; delineates campus land uses; and estimates new building space required to support program growth and expansion through the 2035–36 academic year.

Recognized as one of the top 15 research universities worldwide, UC San Diego is a vibrant and dynamic public institution that provides opportunity for all. The campus is a catalyst for change, sparking discoveries that advance society, drive economic growth and positively impact the

world. Since our founding more than 50 years ago, the population of the La Jolla campus has grown from a handful of students and faculty to more than 38,000 students and 15,000 faculty and staff. The newly adopted LRDP accounts for overall campus growth and outlines a blueprint for this anticipated growth.
