

Ridge Walk: Restoration and Revitalization Project



This project, anticipated to begin later this month, includes restoration and revitalization of Ridge Walk. The project will improve the pedestrian and cyclist experience, making strong and identifiable connections along the north-south axis of campus, as well as to and from the University Center and transit hub. The design restores the legibility of the corridor by improving the paving, planting, and lighting. The design enhancements provide improved access, comfort, clarity, and safety for users, including shaded areas with comfortable seating, enhanced bike and pedestrian paths, and a variety of gathering spaces.

Scripps Institution of Oceanography Pier Railing Replacement Project



This project, anticipated to begin later this month, replaces the wooden railing on the pier which is severely deteriorated in several areas. Despite its continuous maintenance over the last 30 years, the Douglas Fir railing has been subject to both dry rot and termite infestations. The replacement railing includes 316L electro-polished stainless steel, and Ipé cap rails and side rails, anticipated to withstand weather conditions for over 75 years with minimal maintenance in this highly corrosive environment.

The Scripps Institution of Oceanography Pier is one of the world's biggest research piers and is used to launch boats for nearshore research, involving a variety of experiments. It is used for research purposes, scientific diving, sampling, instrument testing, and teaching. Data on ocean conditions and plankton taken from the pier since 1916 provide an unparalleled source of information on changes in the coastal Pacific Ocean.
