### Projects

The location of instructional, research and campus support facilities, such as housing and parking, is directed by UC San Diego's Long Range Development Plan, which is prepared in response to campus enrollment and population projections. ### Recently Completed – Osler Parking Structure

Ribbon cutting for the Osler Parking Structure, located in the School of Medicine Neighborhood at the corner of Gilman Drive and Osler Lane, was held Friday, August 31. This facility provides 1,350 parking spaces with access from Gilman Drive, allowing for a car-free environment on Osler Lane and providing for an important planned pedestrian connection within the School of Medicine Neighborhood. Major campus destinations are located within a 10-minute walk of the parking structure.

UC San Diego recently circulated its 2018 Long Range Development Plan (LRDP) for the La Jolla campus for public review. The 2018 LRDP Environmental Impact Review (EIR) public hearing was held on August 23. The Draft EIR can be viewed online at <http://lrpd.ucsd.edu/campus/review/draft.html>.

The proposed 2018 LRDP provides an updated land use plan to guide future physical development of the La Jolla campus. The LRDP identifies student, faculty and staff growth projections; describes development objectives and principles; delineates campus land uses; and estimates new building space required to support program growth and expansion through the 2035-36 academic year. The proposed 2018 LRDP's anticipated environmental effects are discussed in the Draft Program EIR.

Once certified, the 2018 LRDP EIR will be relied upon for future project-level environmental review of and subsequent tiering for project-specific campus development, as permitted under Section 15152 of the State CEQA Guidelines.
